

#### REPORT FROM THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE - 2009 ACTIVITIES

"The mission of IPPS, with a focus on the global community of those involved in horticultural plant production, is to share knowledge, information, and skills; to provide guidance and support for lifelong career achievements; to increase recognition of the profession; and to maximize the integration of research, education, and horticultural knowledge."

In the year 2009, the new mission statement for IPPS was shared more directly with members through a presentation at the annual conference of the Region of Great Britain and Ireland, following the International Board's tour of Ireland and International Board Meeting. The presentation, by International Secretary-Treasurer Pat Heuser, focused on the future of IPPS and encouraged members to become involved in making sure IPPS is relevant to them and to the industry as the organization evolves to meet current needs.

The newly developed At-Large Member offering attracted five members in 2009 from various areas of the world – from countries outside the geographic scope of the current regions. Future development of this option is expected.

Volume 58 from the 2008 regional conferences was completed in late summer and distributed to all members in book and/or CD formats.

The partnership with the International Society for Horticultural Science (ISHS) to place all the papers from all 58 past proceedings on the PubHort website showed progress in 2009. All past volumes were transformed into digital copies, and abstracts prepared for all the papers. The ISHS office received several test volumes to upload, with an expectation that all papers would be available for members to review in 2010.

Overall membership in IPPS dropped slightly in 2009, with regions reporting as follows:

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL BOARD MEETING

On September 9, 11, and 15, the International Board of Directors met in Galway, Kenmare, and Kilkenny, Ireland with Peter Bingham presiding at the meeting. All eight regions were represented.

#### Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- Minutes of the May 2008 meeting were approved.
- Activities of the International Office were reviewed, including the reported levels of staff time needed to manage the IPPS international operations.
- Year-end membership for 2009 was recorded at 1,883 from all regions, a decrease of 165 in the reported numbers.
- At-large memberships were acknowledged with two renewing from 2008 and three new members for 2009.
- Directors will be researching the process and costs to register the new IPPS logo and tag line within the countries currently within the eight regions to determine the feasibility of this protection.
- Regions are being encouraged to utilize the promotional templates developed last year with their own modifications to personalize them for each region.
- Financial reports through the second quarter of the fiscal year, June 30, 2009, were reviewed, as well as the investments as of that same date. Investments reported 6.1% in earnings so far in 2009, after a drop of 21.3% in 2008.
- A year-end projection on income and expenses for 2009 reflected the likelihood that operations will end with a small loss of just over \$2,000, close to the budget projection for this year.
- The International Editor presented reports regarding publication of Volume 58, being
  distributed in September, with fewer books and CDs produced due to declining
  membership. Noted was that 52% of members take the Proceedings in book format;
  21% take the Proceedings in CD format; and 8% take the Proceedings as both the
  book and CD, leaving 19% that do not receive the Proceedings at all with their
  memberships.
- The Board reviewed updates on the activity to mount the entire collection of Proceedings papers on the ISHS website, with completion expected in 2010.
- Reports from the various Regions, presented by their Directors, were reviewed.
- Estimates for production of Volume 59 were approved.
- The Board decided not to pursue the collection of PowerPoints from Regional Conferences at the international level, leaving this option to the regions to pursue if they desire. However, PowerPoint presentations will not be accepted as "papers" for publication in the Proceedings.
- An international newsletter was approved for posting on the IPPS website twice each year as a way to promote more of the international connection to members. Directors are expected to submit information to the newsletter editor. The editor for the newsletter will be determined after proposals are requested from all regions. Further distribution by email will be at the discretion of each region.

- The president and vice-president will prepare two articles each during the year for regions to use in their newsletters, as another way to maintain international communication with members.
- Volume 59 of the Proceedings will carry the new logo on its front cover, but retain the older symbol on the title page.
- The report prepared by David Hide on all IPPS websites was reviewed and accepted.
- The Board is asking regions to consider proposals for introductory, subsidized, memberships as a way to attract new members, for the International Board to review at its next meeting.
- Members will have the opportunity to receive free subscriptions to Floraculture
   International if they desire. Regional Secretary-Treasurers will include the option for
   members to request this subscription as they join or renew their memberships for
   2010.
- The former Propagator Exchange program was renamed the "IPPS Travel Scholarship" to allow more flexibility for a member to travel to another region to enhance his or her professional knowledge. Promotional materials are being developed.
- New procedures for nominations for the International Award of Honor were reviewed and approved, along with a nomination form.
- The recipient of the Award of Honor for 2010 was identified and approved.
- A cost analysis of the actual cost to support the editorial preparation, production, and distribution of Volume 58 of the *Combined Proceedings* in book and CD formats was reviewed for establishing membership dues to the International Society for 2010.
- Contracts for 2010 were approved at the same levels as 2009 to continue the management support provided by The Heuser Group, Inc. and to continue the editorial services of Dr. Charles W. Heuser.
- Increases in dues for 2010 were approved to provide a balanced budget for 2010 and to bring the dues more in line with the costs of providing administrative support and the costs of preparing, producing, and mailing the Proceedings.
- A budget for 2010 was approved with projected income of \$133,640 and projected expenses of \$133,135 for a budgeted excess of revenue from operations of \$505.
- Shifts were made in the Board-restricted funds to provide more cash reserve for future use.
- Preliminary plans for the 2010 International Tour in the Eastern Region and the 2011 International Tour in Australia were reviewed.
- Officers for 2010 were elected as follows: James Johnson (Eastern) as President;
   Greg McPhee (Australia) as Vice President; and Nobumasa Nito (Japan) as Second Vice President.

# SUMMARY OF THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL TOUR, IRELAND September, 2009

There's no question that Ireland is every bit as beautiful in person as you see it displayed on postcards and in travel books. The International Board and others who joined the group traveling from Dublin to Kilkenny were treated to a memorable journey through the "I" of the "GB&I" – the Region of Great Britain and Ireland. The people of this area are diverse, industrious, and friendly. Even with an economic downturn settling in, the spirit of the

country seemed optimistic for a more prosperous future, and the history and tradition of the Irish culture seems to transcend the problems of the day.

Many thanks are due the organizing committee of the Region and the attentive, informative, and entertaining assistance from our tour guide, Philip Moreau. We all appreciate how much work and planning goes into these tours, from the hosts to all the IPPS members who help out with various tasks ahead of, during, and after the tour – thanks to all of you! Thanks, too, for the useful rainy day jackets supplies to all tour members – after a long, wet summer; however, our hosts rejoiced in our group bringing sunshine to them for the time of our visit – obviously a good word or two in high places by IPPS President Pete Bingham.

We began our tour in the capital city, Dublin, where we toured a typical city, enchanted by the pubs and restaurants, and the excitement of the national competition of "hurling" -- their national sport -- being held in the sports arena on the day of our arrival. Guinness, that well-known Irish beer, celebrated 250 years of operation and the brewing facility in center city Dublin was a sight we didn't miss.

The group's tour of Dublin included time in Phoenix Park, the largest enclosed urban park in Ireland and the National Botanic Gardens, founded in 1795. Tully Nurseries, one of Ireland's largest wholesale nurseries, was our afternoon stop, where Martin Tully showcased a wide range of plant material under their winning brand, "Winning Plants."

That evening, we were treated to a traditional pub dinner back in Dublin, before leaving for our tour of the countryside. In Kildare we stopped at Johnstown Garden Centre and then visited the Irish National Stud, a real point of interest for Ireland's horse breeding program. The grounds included wonderful landscaping, with a lovely Japanese Garden, as a highlight. The afternoon was filled with two nursery visits – Rentes Plants, Ltd. and Flip Shram Nurseries. We then continued to the city of Galway, on the bay, a wonderful walking city.

On our tour of Connemara, we had a chance to really see the more natural landscape of Ireland, including a stop at a peat blanket bog where we learned how peat develops, how it is harvested, and its importance to the people as a fuel. We also visited the Kylemore Abbey, still a functioning Abbey, but with areas open to visitors who can marvel at the history of this facility, formerly a girls school, hidden in the mountains of the country. We toured through other small towns on the western seaboard before returning to Galway. The next day, we drove around Galway Bay and stopped at a scenic stop above Galway Bay for photos of the limestone cliffs and the wide range of Irish wildflowers that thrive in the sheltered crevices. The outstanding view that day, however, was of the Cliffs of Moher, a wall of rock that plunges 700 feet to the Atlantic Ocean below.

Glennbrook Nurseries was on the tour that day, after which we visited the area around Bunratty Castle, where IPPS was center stage at a medieval banquet in the castle. The following day the group traveled to one of the most picturesque villages in Ireland – Adare – then traveled on through County Kerry and into Killarney, where we rode in "jaunting cars" for views of Killarney's largest lake, Lough Leane.

In Kenmare, we were treated to sights of gaily painted traditional buildings enhanced with flowers and walked around the Muckross Gardens, created in the 19<sup>th</sup> century on the shores of Muckross Lake. From there, the group travelled across the Caha Mountains to Glengarriff, and took a boat ride to Garnish Island, home of the Italian Gardens planted with exotic species from all around the world. The gardens of Ilnaculin, formerly privately owned and bequeathed to the Irish people in 1953, is known for the richness and color of the plant material that changes with the seasons.

And then, what trip to Ireland would miss a climb up the steps of Blarney Castle to kiss the blarney stone – or at least to take a look at it! Seems like the "gift of gab" was already present among those in our party who took the chance of being held almost upside down to kiss the fabled stone. The castle, built around 1446, is itself worth the excursion, made even better by time enjoying the town of Blarney, home to beautiful woolen clothing made by Blarney Mills.

The next day took us to Waterford by route of Cobh Heritage Centre, a historical stop explaining with great passion the history of emigration from Ireland to the New World. We visited Mount Congreve Gardens, owned by Ambrose Congreve and tended by his head gardener for many years, Herman Dool. The 700+ acres of trees, shrubs, and a myriad of plant material in all types of environments, was magnificent.

Our final day of touring ended up in Kilkenny, where a walking tour showed us the Rothe House, a merchant's home built in 1594, now housing a Museum of Kilkenny antiques. St. Canice's Cathedral, dating from the 6<sup>th</sup> century, was also a fascinating visit, as was the town of Kilkenny itself – charming, easily walkable, and full of Irish spirit.

Once again, everyone involved in IPPS was reminded of the camaraderie, the shared knowledge, the respect and appreciation for different cultures, and the friendships over many years that have become a hallmark of this organization.
