



REPORT FROM THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE – 2012 ACTIVITIES

"The mission of IPPS, with a focus on the global community of those involved in horticultural plant production, is to share knowledge, information, and skills; to provide guidance and support for lifelong career achievements; to increase recognition of the profession; and to maximize the integration of research, education, and horticultural knowledge."

During 2012, the International Board of Directors engaged in extensive discussion and research about cost containment in the face of rising per member costs associated with producing the *Combined Proceedings* in book and CD formats. The Board's focus has been on how to sustain and grow the organization's membership by providing the values important to the members, including shared knowledge from all the regions' conference presentations, captured in the papers that comprise the *Proceedings*. The technology opportunities of today have been considered in terms of their viability in IPPS operations and the significance of the technology to today's generation of members.

The International Society for Horticultural Science (ISHS) offered its services in publishing the book and CD forms of the *Proceedings*, while continuing to post all the papers on their PubHort website. IPPS members continued to receive up to ten free downloads of papers and over 1400 members arranged to have an account to download papers. The following use of the PubHort website was reported:

*2010: 149 papers downloaded by 41 unique users**
*2011: 252 papers downloaded by 72 unique users**
*2012: 226 papers downloaded by 69 unique users**

**these could be IPPS members or others downloading papers*

However, more than 12,000 abstracts were viewed, meaning people all over the world are now able to see and appreciate the wealth of knowledge that IPPS brings to the field of plant propagation and production.

At the International Board Meeting in October, the Board discussed options for changes in IPPS operations and *Proceedings* publication and distribution, with diligent consideration of the financial implications of each decision. The following highlights from that meeting set the stage for changes in 2013 and beyond, as the Board considered at length the following four areas, and made decisions as noted:

1. The unique purpose of IPPS – is it still valid?

- a. There was consensus that the IPPS mission of seeking and sharing information globally was still valid, but costs must be contained and the methods of sharing be rethought with today's technology options.

2. What is the future for the Proceedings in its current process and format?

- a. The Board agreed that the Proceedings in its current format could no longer be sustained – and was no longer an important part of membership to many IPPS members; therefore, the sharing of papers presented at regional conferences will be done in new, more cost-effective ways.

3. What are plans for cost containment?

- a. The Board discussed the frequency of International Board Meetings and agreed to retain the annual schedule for the International Tour and Board Meeting at least through 2015, with half of the travel costs taken from undesignated Restricted Funds instead of the full cost borne by the annual operating budget – a savings of about \$5,000 in the annual budget.
- b. The Board agreed there was no need to have the International Editor attend the International Tour and Meeting, with savings of about \$5,000 in the operating budget.
- c. The Board discussed how to capture the information in the front pages of the *Combined Proceedings* – the information on awards, etc. from each region – in some other way to save publishing costs.
- d. The Board confirmed the decision made earlier to cancel the meeting of Regional Secretary-Treasurers scheduled for 2013, as a cost savings to the international budget as well as to the regions. This decision makes \$8,000 in set-aside funds now available in the operating budget to offset any deficits.

4. What will dues be for the foreseeable future?

- a. The Board confirmed its previous decision for no international dues increase in 2013.
- b. The Board agreed to no international dues increase for 2014, and a look at operations in that year for any possible reduction in dues going forward.

Additional highlights of that International Board Meeting are listed later in this report; however, by January 2013 the International Board had agreed to these new changes in how to continue to offer the Combined Proceedings as an optional member benefit:

- An agreement was negotiated with ISHS for that organization to assume responsibility for production and distribution of the Proceedings in book and CD formats at significantly reduced costs and somewhat altered presentation.
- The International Editor was retained to continue editorial services.
- The papers from each Region, after editing from the Regional Editor, are to be available to members through ISHS' website to allow members to review them sooner – within three months of their presentations at conferences. ISHS will make necessary software changes to accommodate this IPPS member benefit.
- A new agreement with ISHS for 2013 and beyond significantly lowered the annual fees for use of the PubHort website and increased members' access to 15 free downloads beginning in 2013.

With all relevant decisions made, Volume 62 is being published by ISHS and will be distributed to members from that organization late in 2013.

The Board not only held its usual meeting of the International Board in conjunction with the International Tour and Regional Conference in Japan in October, but also continued to conduct business via telephone conferences during the year.

Volumes 58, 59, and 60 of the *Combined Proceedings* were added to the PubHort website as members continued to take advantage of the ability to view abstracts from papers compiled in those 60 volumes.

Volume 61 of the *Combined Proceedings* was distributed to all members in book and/or CD formats in October. About 50 libraries around the world continue to purchase copies to keep their collections up to date.

Overall membership in IPPS dropped by 6% in 2012, with regions reporting on June 1 as follows:

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2011 INTERNATIONAL BOARD MEETING

On October 25 and 26, 2012 the International Board of Directors met in Hamamatsu, Japan, with David Cliffe presiding at the meeting. All eight regions were represented. Again taking advantage of available technology, the International Editor was able to record the meeting through tape-recorded input, allowing the International Secretary to prepare minutes without being present at the meeting.

Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- Minutes of the September 2012 conference call Board meeting were approved as previously distributed.
- Regions were reminded to determine the dates of their conferences for the next three years or so to avoid conflicts with dates of other regions and the international tour dates. Dates are to be reported to the International Office for posting on the website's calendar of Regional Events.
- Activities of the International Office were reviewed, including the report of staff time invested in managing the IPPS International operations, numbers of five-year membership plaques distributed, statistics on website viewings, reports on Proceedings orders and inventory, and similar operating reports.

- Membership numbers for 2012 were reviewed, showing a loss of 115 members this year, and a total decline in membership over the past 11 years of 1,003 members.
- Financial reports through September 30 were reviewed, reflecting 96% of budgeted income received and expenses unable to be fully compared to budget because the costs of printing and distributing the Proceedings were not yet report.
- The performance of investments was reviewed, with a reported return of 7.8% for the year to date on IPPS investments.
- The International Editor presented reports regarding publication of Volume 61 (the Proceedings from 2011 conferences) which had already been distributed to members. Also reviewed was the status of papers received for Volume 62 and the preliminary estimate of costs to produce that volume in a size with fewer pages because of fewer papers submitted.
- The International Editor reported that papers from Volumes 58 and 59 had been prepared in the proper TXT (text) and PDF formats and sent to ISHS for inclusion on the PubHort website.
- Reports from the various Regions, presented by their Directors, were reviewed.
- The representative of the South Africa region advised that their region is to be called the "IPPS Southern Africa Region" instead of Southern African.
- The Board decided that student members from any region could be given access to the ten free downloads of papers from the PubHort website, with an annual update of the list of student members from each region.
- The Membership/Marketing Chair – Ian Duncalf of New Zealand – will have a membership survey ready by the end of December for regions to implement with the members.
- The Southern Region and the Region of Great Britain and Ireland are planning to implement the exchange program in the coming year, with costs supported by the International Society's Exchange Program fund.
- The recipient of the Award of Honor for 2013 was identified and approved.
- Preliminary plans for the 2013 International Tour in the Western Region, as well as the 2014 International Tour in the Southern Africa Region, were reviewed.
- Reviewed without change a variety of Position Descriptions for officers, Directors, Alternate Directors, Regional Secretary-Treasurers, the International Editor, and the International Secretary.
- The International Board agreed to schedule conference calls each quarter, beginning in December 2012, and following in 2013 with February, May, August, and December.
- The Board elected officers for 2013 as follows:
 - Chair: David Cliffe, Australian Region
 - President: Verl Holden, Western Region
 - Vice President: Hans Sittig, Southern Africa Region
 - Treasurer: Alan Jones, Eastern Region
- The Board heard a proposal from the GB&I Region that IPPS become more actively involved in soliciting international sponsorships for financial support, not in conflict with sponsors solicited by regions, and referred this to the Marketing Committee for more specific details to be prepared for Board review.
- The Board discussed possibilities of holding an international symposium with another organization, as well as the possibility of creating video presentations as revenue generators.
