

REPORT FROM THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE – 2007 ACTIVITIES

The year 2007 was a year of thoughtful projection of the role of IPPS in the international plant propagation and plant production community for the future. The International Board of Directors undertook the start of a planning process to help focus the Society on its mission now and into the future. During a planning session facilitated by International Secretary-Treasurer Patricia E. Heuser, the International Officers, Directors, Alternate Directors, and Regional Secretary-Treasurers participated in several hours of discussion about how IPPS will best serve its mission and its members as the organization moves forward.

While the mission statement itself has not yet been approved in modified language, there was consensus among Board members that the scope of individuals who benefit from IPPS membership has broadened beyond the original group of propagators to those who are involved in all aspects of plant production, those who manage the production process, horticultural educators and students, as well as plant breeders, explorers, collectors, and conservationists. Also noted by the group were the important contributions of related groups such as suppliers to the horticultural industry, those involved in administration within plant production facilities, and those in the retail, landscape, and landscape installation professions. The overall sense of direction that came from the session emphasized the need to retain the unique qualities of IPPS while broadening our appeal to a larger scope of potential members. Further work on achieving identified goals for the Society will happen at the May 2008 International Board Meeting.

A significant step toward enlarging the IPPS value worldwide was Board approval to create an "at-large" category of membership for those individuals around the world who are outside the geographic boundaries of established IPPS regions. The office has received inquiries about membership from these people seeking to broaden their knowledge with the wealth of information available in the *Combined Proceedings*; however, they have no affinity with the geography and plants of the current regions. In 2008, they will have the opportunity to join as individual members and receive the *Proceedings*, and will be encouraged to attend any of the regional conferences as well as to submit papers for publication in the *Proceedings* in a separate section.

Another major step toward international presence was the final approval by the Board to place all the volumes of Proceedings on the PubHort website of the International Society for Horticultural Science (ISHS). This process will allow members and non-members to view abstracts from all 56 years of submitted papers, with the opportunity to purchase complete papers. The partnership with ISHS provides a new level of recognition of IPPS' collective knowledge and also a source of revenue into the future. The International Editor, Dr. Charles Heuser, is heading the effort to arrange electronic scanning of all past volumes and the uploading of the data to the ISHS site.

In October, another first-time IPPS event occurred – the Regional Secretary-Treasurers attended a portion of the International Tour and participated in a training session on how to best use the new database, as well as a session on learning from each other about procedures, challenges, and successes in the regions' operations. They participated in the Planning Session and also attended part of the International Board of Directors meeting. This participation, with costs shared by the International budget and the regions, provided a unique opportunity for these people to meet and interact with the international leadership

and to better understand the value and responsibilities of the International Board of Directors.

In March of 2007, the International Editor and the International Secretary-Treasurer attended the conference of the newly-accepted Southern African Region, and participated in a tour hosted by the leaders of that region. Both were truly grateful to be able to represent the Society on the occasion of the new Region's 10th anniversary, to present a charter from the International Board and greetings from James Gilbert, International President. The opportunity to visit several areas of South Africa with the regional leaders and other international guests was an eye-opening experience. Both came away with renewed appreciation for this "mecca" of plant material and a better understanding of the industry challenges in this economically-developing country.

Volume 56 of the *Combined Proceedings* was completed in September of 2007 and shipped around the world with the new method of airmail shipping that allowed bulk shipment to countries for further distribution by their postal systems, a process that speeded up delivery and avoided lost books and CDs.

The database continues to function as a useful record-keeping tool, with Regional Secretary-Treasurers becoming more comfortable and more proficient at making the best use of its features. The website also provides updated information to members and others, and more features will continue to be added as time goes on.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership in IPPS dropped slightly in 2007, and a newly established Membership Committee is actively engaged in activities to help understand why membership is decreasing, and to consider ways to assist the regions in attracting new members.

The following reflects membership in IPPS for 2007, based on numbers reported by the Regional Secretary-Treasurers either midway through the year or at year-end*:

INTERNATIONAL BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

On October 24 and October 27, 2007 the International Board of Directors met in Asheville, North Carolina and Nashville, Tennessee with James Gilbert of the Southern Region of North America presiding at the meeting. Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- Financial reports and investments performance were reviewed and the overall excellent financial health of IPPS was confirmed.
- The operations of the International Officer were reviewed.
- Regions were asked to provide information on how to obtain lists of University Libraries in the region, to promote more sales of the Combined Proceedings.
- Regions agreed to begin reporting membership numbers at December 31 to provide more consistent data for trending annual membership numbers.
- Membership reports for 2007 were reviewed, noting a decrease of 134 members worldwide. Current membership is 2,097 (as of 9-30-07).
- The International Office was asked to provide a sticker or plaque of some type with the five-year membership plaque to identify the year joined or year the plaque was presented. A report on those receiving five-year membership plaques was reviewed, with 48 plaques sent to members in various regions for 2007.
- The report on orders for the production of Volume 56 of the Combined Proceedings was reviewed, with 1,475 books and 650 CDs ordered. Shipping of Volume 56 was reported to be in process.
- With some regions selecting their samples of papers to be posted on the website for this year, we now have four years of sample *Proceedings* papers on the IPPS website.
- Production costs for Volume 57, with small cost increases, as well as page allocations by regions, were reviewed and accepted.
- The Board approved changing the information in the front section of the Proceedings to match the leadership lists to the same year as the year in which the papers were presented.
- The Award of Honor recipient for 2007 was selected – Richard E. Bir of the Eastern Region, North America.
- The Board reviewed plans for the 2008 International Tour and Board meeting, hosted by the New Zealand Region in May of 2008. The tour begins May 10 and ends May 22 in Auckland with the regional conference at that location.
- The Board also reviewed information regarding the 2009 International Tour and Board Meeting, hosted by the Region of Great Britain and Ireland. The tour will begin September 6 and conclude September 15 in Kilkenny, Ireland, with the regional conference.
- A report was shared on progress toward development of promotional materials in a template format to be used by all regions – further development was suspended until the planning process was completed.
- A review of staff performance was conducted and comments of appreciation provided to Dr. Charles Heuser, International Editor and to Patricia Heuser and her staff group handling the International Office.
- Regions were directed to establish the dates of their hosting the International Tour at least five years ahead so that regions can set dates for their Regional Conferences without overlapping on that event.
- A report was shared on voting on the latest Constitutional amendment regarding elimination of voting rights on the Board for the International Editor and International Secretary-Treasurer, with passage of the amendment certain.
- Reports from the Directors of each region were shared with the Board.
- The Investment Policy was modified slightly on the recommendation of the current investment broker.

- A written Expense Reimbursement Policy for International Officers and Directors was approved, along with a modified claim form.
- The Board reviewed an outline of a Policy and Procedures Manual that would consolidate numerous operating policies in various documents into one Manual. Also considered was the need to rewrite the Constitution to more accurately and simply reflect current and future governance and operating situations.
- Action on a proposed arrangement with the American Nursery and Landscape Assn. to assume publication of the Journal of Environmental Horticulture was tabled until further research was conducted relating to the potential for similar arrangements with the "Propagation of Plants" journal.
- The Board approved implementation of plans to have all previous Proceedings electronically scanned and archives on CDs, and to have them mounted on the website of the International Society for Horticulture Science (ISHS) in a searchable form to read abstracts and download full papers. Under the terms of agreement with ISHS, IPPS members will have 10 free downloads per year, with additional downloads on a paid basis. Implementation is expected within the coming year.
- The Board approved establishing an "at large" membership category for individuals around the world who are not within the geographic territory of an existing region, with dues that include the cost of International dues, the cost of the Proceedings, and an additional service fee for administration by the International Office.
- A 13-point action plan to rejuvenate membership recruitment and retention was shared with the Board, with information and assistance by Regions a major component.
- Directors and Alternate Directors were asked, where possible, to stay and participate in Regional Conferences that follow the International Tour, as a way to share the international knowledge with regional members.
- The Board set aside up to \$12,000 to fund propagator exchanges between regions, allowing \$3,000 for each exchange (\$1,500 to each region) to support the cost of individuals experiencing this opportunity.
- A preliminary budget for 2008 was approved, with an anticipated shortfall of operating revenue.
- Dues for the *Proceedings* in book format were increased by \$2 to accommodate increases in mailing costs.
- There was consensus in using the acronym "IPPS" with a tag line that explains what the organization stands for, but without the full name, as a way to broaden the group's appeal to those involved in plant production beyond propagation. Further development of this idea will come at the May 2008 International Board Meeting.
