Katie noted there were no major notes from the International Office at this time. She will be working with Tom to finalize a budget to send to the Board in the next few weeks.



#### IV. Editor's Report


**Bob Geneve** 

- a. Report of Activities for 2022
  - Bob reported that we are doing well for the next Proceedings and have papers from South Africa and Japan. North American papers are often received in December. Any additional regions that had a meeting and can send manuscripts, please do so as soon as possible.
  - ii. The number of Proceedings papers were very reduced during the past few Covid years and we want to get back to full participation from all regions for the Proceedings.
  - iii. All papers get edited in January/February and get published on the website around March.
- b. Discussion of Pros/Cons of Open Access online vote results
  - i. Katie reviewed the results of the online survey for each region for changing the Proceedings access.
    - 1. Options for the survey were:
      - a. Option 1: Open-Access for ALL Proceedings to non-members
      - b. Option 2: Open-Access for SOME Proceedings to non-members with a specified number of volumes closed to only members
      - c. Option 3: Leave the Proceedings as is with no changes (all Proceedings only available to members)
      - d. Option 4: Create abstracts for those papers that do not contain one and have open-access to non-members for abstracts with the papers closed to members


#### First Choice Responses:





- ii. Richard Beaumont pointed out if we go with Option 2, we can always change it to Option 1; we can't as easily go from Option 1 (full open-access) to Option 2 (some closed access).
- iii. Steve Castorani stated Eastern met earlier during the day and voted for Option 2. Eastern Region also decided that most members don't join for the Proceedings but for networking, reduced costs for conferences, etc. The open-access gives a good marketing tool as well.
- iv. Dharam stated Western Region also wanted Option 2. He also recommended we request abstracts for the immediate year that would be available for non-members immediately.
- v. Laura Miller stated that although not Southern Region's first choice, they would accept option 2.
- vi. John Messina stated option 4 was Australia's primary option but they understand it is difficult to select this option without having all abstracts already created; the second option was mostly for Option 2. Tony stated option 2 would be fine.
- vii. Elsa du Toit mentioned they wanted Option 4 (abstracts) but really just want information available to encourage people into IPPS and it's a trial-and-error situation and if membership keeps declining maybe we should revisit.
- viii. Richard Beaumont pointed out there is software to generate abstracts.
- ix. Bob Geneve stated open-access allows more authors to consider contributing which could improve our Proceedings by having further publication options.
- x. Motion proposed for Option 2 with closed access for one volume (the most recent) by Steve Castorani and seconded by Brie Arthur.
  - 1. Jim and Dharam mentioned Western originally asked for two years but that with one volume closed and one being worked on, it's essentially two years.
  - 2. Vote was taken and unanimous for 1 volume to remain closed.

V. Treasurer's Report, Finance/Investment, & Sponsorship Committee Tom Saunders Tom stated we have six North American and three International sponsors in 2021, expect 10 in 2023, allowing dues to remain the same. He acknowledged all members and especially the International Board for the team effort in sponsorship as companies know who IPPS because of our members and Board members, so they are willing to join as a sponsor when contacted.

The Investment committee continues to meet 3-4x a year with the current plans to focus on keeping the money in the approved percentages.

#### VI. Committee Reports

 Strategic Planning
 Katie mentioned we need to decide whether to hold a Strategic Planning meeting during the International Tour in 2023 and if we need to bring in an expert to assist.

Tony Van der Staay (Strategic Planning Committee Chair) stated that it's going to take a while to start the difficult process.

Steve Castorani recommended that we get the process started at the in-person meeting by understanding the past plans. He, and Brie Arthur, also discussed that maybe we do not need to focus on changing the strategic plan as much as focusing on other campaigns that will benefit the society more (for example: membership drive, changing to producers/production society, etc.). Brie also stated that she has been on many strategic planning committees with experts and that they often do not understand the organizations enough to be helpful in the long-run.

Bob Geneve mentioned that the International Tour finishes in Durham and there are university employees that facilitate strategic plans for organizations and that we could benefit from them. Secondly, HRI is probably the strongest nursery arm in North America right now and are reaching out with webinar presentations which is fantastic promotional material for them with 800-1,000 attendees per webinar. This could be another option for IPPS and/or the strategic plan.

Action Item: Katie to find as much past information on Strategic Planning as possible and circulate the information before the next meeting.

#### b. Membership

i. Dharam Sharma recommended IPPS potentially securing patents for and from plant researchers and licensing nurseries against royalty for propagating the elite material. He believes this would bring researchers, nurserymen, and others under the umbrella of IPPS for better opportunities. He stated that the Australian Almond Board and others have made this happen. He would like to know if anyone believes this is a possibility to begin exploring the legal and any other options, if so, we should create a committee for such.

- 1. Brie Arthur feels there is a huge conflict of interest with members making millions of dollars off their personal patents and if IPPS starts doing the same, we would/could become their competition.
- 2. Tom Saunders and Tony Van der Staay believe this is too big an undertaking with too many laws and too many issues.
- ii. Exchange Program financial assistance requested from Southern Region
  - 1. Southern Region applied for \$2,000 as they are hoping the European delegate will come to the International Tour and the cost is much larger than normal years because of it being a longer International Tour.
  - 2. Bob Geneve stated it should be going through the Education Committee, which no longer exists (and mainly only existed to make these recommendations to the International Board).
  - 3. Tom Saunders requested the Board make a decision to fund the region to cover the cost as one check from a sponsor covers this. Tony Van der Staay agrees that if we are bringing someone in for an International Tour, we raise the sponsorship money to utilize it to bring more people to the society. Tony moves we fund the \$2,000.
    - a. Richard Beaumont added discussion regarding long-term exchanges and how they work and that we need a proper rotation with all regions but that this has fallen away over the years.
    - b. Tony stated that Australia and South Africa have an exchange program and it has always been this way (no additional rotation with other regions). The difference this year, with Southern's request, is that the Europe to Southern Exchange is asking for money for the International Tour, not their specific exchange program.
    - c. Richard wants to move the program further and stated that every time there is an international meeting, International should cover the extra costs for any respective exchange.
    - d. Tony motioned that we pay for the \$2,000 for Southern this year, seconded by Brie. Brie thinks it's an important precedent we set and that this is the strongest program we have for young members to provide them this opportunity and that these younger people will more likely stick with IPPS for years. Motion approved to pay unanimously.
  - 4. Bob stated it's a no-brainer but we need to readjust the pipeline since there is no education committee. The board needs to determine how much money gets set aside for this activity. Richard made a

comment to get a specific sponsor for this specific activity/person. Needs to be a budget item, criteria for selecting person, requirements.

Action Item: Katie and Tom to budget \$2,000 for host region attendee.

5. Katie recommended we create a committee to figure out a new pipeline and process. Brie offered to chair with Keith Osborne and Antony Toledo volunteering to join.

#### iii. Potential for South American Region creation

1. Katie commented we have interest from South America in creating a region. Eastern Region of NA has more information and contact with the people in South America but that we will all work together to determine their interest and viability of a region.

#### iv. Regional Reports

- 1. Dharam stated that India has issues paying for membership. Katie stated we need to know what option they can use as she has contacted India multiple times over the past year requesting a payment option that would work for them. Tim Lawrance-Owen reinforced that we need to have communication between all, and especially new, regions with International to be able to assist with problems.
- 2. Dharam recommended we invite India to the next Board meeting to discuss their issues.

Action Item: Katie to invite India to next board meeting

#### VII. Other Reports

a. Report on 2023 International Tour and Meeting, Southern Region NA International board members will be able to put a deposit in for about 2 weeks before the general public. This should open shortly. The goal is 56 people. After the two week time period, registration with deposits will open to all.
